
Members and Guests night March 12th

SATURN - Hubble Space Telescope 22 March 2004 NASA, ESA and E Karkoschka (University of Arizona)

Saturn in opposition, 10th May

Join us at the Creebridge House Hotel, Minnigaff on Saturday 10th May, starting at 9:30 pm, to observe Saturn at his closest approach – with the entire face of the planet lit up by the sun – view the rings, the moons, the Cassini Division, everything. We will be observing from the back of the hotel gardens, looking south over Minnigaff. The hotel has generously offered us the use of the dining room and if the weather is against us we plan to take the telescopes indoors and provide a hands-on session on digital astrophotography, the nuts and bolts of taking pictures with a digital camera and a telescope.

Aurora Borealis in Galloway

It's not often we get a display of the northern lights this far south in Scotland, and even less often that we get a photo of them. This one was taken from a location south of Sorbie, well outside the Dark Sky Park, looking north-east over Sorbie.





The picture was taken for 10 secs at ISO1600, f4, with a Canon 400D unguided. Time was ~10:15 pm. The street lights in the lower right are those of Sorbie village and Reiffer Park. In time they will be replaced by white LED street lighting, and that will greatly improve the south Machars dark skies.
